MONDAY, 26 OCTOBER 2009

The aim of the first day was to acquaint the guests from Zunino e Partner and University of Valencia with the territory of Boka Kotorska where the activities of Expeditio are being implemented. For this reason, we first gathered in Kotor and visited the cultural core of the Old Town. After a working lunch, we visited Perast, an important cultural destination within the municipality of Kotor, and then the town of Herceg Novi. On the way back we passed through the Municipality of Tivat.

The internal meeting of the Sostenuto partners started with a discussion about the activities conducted so far within the Sostenuto project, gained experiences and recommendations. - Presentation of Zunino e Partner's activities, presented by Jacques Mattei



We expected that the presentation would be attended by representatives of the Delegation of the EC to Montenegro and The Ministry of European Integration of Montenegro who had been invited to participate, but unfortunately they did not come.

Raul from University of Valencia had an advisory role in the meeting, commenting after presentations.

After the lunch, we continued the discussion about further plans, joint activities and models of collaboration. We decided on a time frame for the next meetings and possible joint activities within the project.

Since it had been already dark the previous day when we passed through the municipality of Tivat we decided to visit Tivat after the afternoon session. Because of that, we postponed for the next day's morning session a final decision about the time frame of further activities.

It was agreed that, according to need, we would organize additional meetings and intensify our internal communication by e-mail, skype, etc. We concluded that our communication so far has not been sufficient.

We discusses themes that could be topics for the study visits that will be organized for the delegations from Italy and Montenegro, about possible activities during the visits and a suitable time frame. A possibility of organizing a workshop during the study visit was mentioned. Further discussed was the activity which includes the analysis of EU documents and our local legislation and possible activity of their comparison in order to draw further guidelines. We also talked about publishing the results of our activities, as one of the results of the project.

During the meeting, we had a short visit of the deputy mayor of the Municipality of Tivat, to whom the project and the plans for the next period were briefly presented.



After that we had consultations with Expeditio collaborators who are conducting a research within the activity "Cultural Needs of Youth in Boka Kotorska". They presented the concept of the prepared questionnaire which was then discussed and suggestions for its improvement given. University of Valencia had an important role in giving suggestions about the questionnaire. The partners from ZEP expressed interest for conducting a similar research on their territory in order to make comparisons.

After the lunch, a meeting with representatives of the local governments of Kotor, Tivat and Herceg Novi had been planned. Unfortunately, only the representative of the Municipality of Tivat came and the project was briefly presented to her.

At the end of the third day, we exchanged our impressions of the meeting.

Additional note:

In addition to formal part of Sostenuto meetings, Expeditio took a chance to discuss with Raul about another current project on National Park of Porkletije in the northern part of Montenegro. He suggested to consider a concept of Ecomuseums which is focused on the identity of a place, largely based on local participation and aiming to enhance the welfare and development of local communities. Raul said that he woudl contact Italian expert Mr Maurizio Maggi who is dealing with this topic.

Ecomuseums originated in France, the concept being developed by George Henri Rivière and Hugues de Varine, who coined the term 'ecomusée' in 1971. The term "éco" is a shortened form for "écologie", but it refers especially to a new idea of holistic interpretation of cultural heritage, in opposition to the focus on specific items and objects, performed by traditional museums. There are presently about 300 operating ecomuseums in the world; about 200 are in Europe, mainly in France, Italy, Spain and Poland.
